Dr. Maggie Opondo is the socio-economic and cultural studies coordinator in the Institute for Climate Change and Adaptation (ICCA) at the University of Nairobi. She has researched and published widely on the impacts of climate change: vulnerability and adaptation in Africa; climate smart agriculture; human health; livelihoods and poverty; the linkages between development and climate change in Africa; building resilience and adapting to climate extremes and disasters; and vulnerability assessments of climate change impacts; smallholder agriculture (tea, coffee, horticulture, tobacco and livestock); gender and labour rights in global value chains; ethical trade and corporate social and environmental responsibility; and trade policy. She has also been instrumental in mainstreaming and integrating gender in agricultural research and development projects and programs. She was a coordinating lead author of Chapter 13 (Livelihoods and Poverty), on the Inter-governmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) Fifth Assessment Report of Working Group II. She has served and still serves on various boards at both the advisory and editorial levels. She is one of the founding members of the Institute for Climate Change and Adaptation (ICCA) at the University of Nairobi.
